



School Safety & Emergency Management

AJHAE complies with applicable requirements established by:

- Ohio Revised Code (ORC)
- Ohio Administrative Code (OAC)
- Ohio Department of Education and Workforce (ODEW)
- Ohio school safety requirements
- Applicable community school sponsor standards and expectations

Emergency Preparedness

AJHAE maintains emergency management and safety procedures designed to help protect students and staff during emergencies and unexpected situations.

Emergency preparedness procedures may address situations including:

- Fire emergencies
- Severe weather and tornadoes
- School safety threats
- Evacuations
- Secure and lockdown situations
- Medical emergencies
- Hazardous material incidents
- Other emergency situations that may impact school operations or safety

Emergency Drills

The school conducts required safety drills and emergency management exercises in accordance with Ohio law and applicable safety regulations.

Drills may include:

- Fire drills
- Tornado drills
- School safety drills
- Lockdown or secure drills
- Emergency management exercises

These drills help students and staff practice emergency response procedures and improve school preparedness.

Student & Staff Safety

AJHAE works to promote a culture of safety through:

- Staff training
- Emergency planning
- Safety partnerships with local authorities
- Positive school climate initiatives
- Clear emergency procedures
- Ongoing safety reviews and preparedness efforts

Students and staff are expected to follow school safety procedures during all drills and emergency situations.

Parent Communication

The school may communicate with families regarding:

- Emergency situations
- Safety procedures
- School closures or delays
- Emergency reunification procedures when necessary
- Important safety updates

Parents and guardians are encouraged to maintain updated contact information with the school to support effective communication during emergencies.

Collaboration with Emergency Responders

AJHAE may collaborate with:

- Local law enforcement
- Fire departments
- Emergency management agencies
- Public safety officials
- Health and safety agencies

to support school safety planning and emergency preparedness efforts.
